Spanish: same as English, plus Áá Èè Íí Óó Úú Ññ

To apply an accent to letters A, E, I, O, U, a, e, i, o, or u, type the letter followed by ` (left of number 1).

Eenya: type N or n, followed by the ~ (shift, left of number 1).

The accents will look better after you run LinkLetter SDN.

French: English, plus à è ì ò ù Áá Èè Íí Óó Úú Îâ ê î ô û Çç

To apply accents to letters using FDN Cursive:

1. Accent grave: type letter followed by ` (left of number 1)
2. Accent acute: type letter followed by ~ (shift, left of number 1)
3. Accent circumflex: type letter followed by ^ (shift 6)
4. C-cedilla: type C or c, then \ (near the Enter/return key)

The accent will not look quite right until you run LinkLetter FDN.

German: same as English, plus Ää Öö Üü

To apply an umlaut to letters A, O, U, a, o, or u, using GDN

Cursive, type the letter and type the accent key ` (left of number 1).

The umlaut will look better after you run LinkLetter GDN.
