

These are complicated fonts developed for use in the Peruvian jungle. For the story of these fonts, see the AIDI Readme in the AIDI folder on your CD. You'll also want to read the ReadMe to find out how to use the fonts.

The chart AIDI Accent Chart.pdf gives all the possible letter-accent combinations. You will find this PDF in the AIDI folder on your CD.

The fonts with "Acentos" in their names have all the symbols used in the languages of the Peruvian jungle. The other "regular" 26 letters of the English alphabet are also available.

There are very few non-letters available in the Acentos fonts. The available punctuation characters are: period, comma, question mark, exclamation mark, inches (double straight quote), foot (single straight quote), hyphen, colon, semicolon, inverted question mark, inverted exclamation mark, and left and right single and double curly quotes. None of the others work.
